Local Talent to Star in Hollis Town Band's 'Pops' Concert

The Hollis Town Band, under the direction of Harry Tong, will turn the spotlight on Nashua area musical talent in a Pops Concert Sunday at 3 p.m. in the Walters Auditorium, Hollis Area High School. The soloists will include a new member of the band, Marty Schwartz, Hollis dentist who will be featured in "Allegro Con Brio," a trumpet concerto. Pepperell resident Chris Anderson, a free-lance tuba player, will display his virtuosity in a piece called "Tuba." Miki Ferland, first flutist with the band, will

perform in "Baroque and Blue," a piece for flutes and concert band. Roger Whittlesey, a graduate of University of Lowell, and music teacher in Tewksbury, Mass., will present one of his own works, "Three Modes for Percussion." The Hollis Band, which co-sponsors and plays for the annual strawberry and apple festivals, has greatly expanded since Tong took over the baton last September. It now boasts a bassoon, oboe, timpani, and full brass and woodwind sections. The growth has also enabled the

band to perform a broader range of music from Shostakovich to "The Muppets." The 'Pops' format is not new to the band. The informal style of tables and chairs provides a relaxed atmosphere in which to enjoy the music and refreshments that will be available. Tickets are available from band members or Harry Tong, Hampshire Music Company, Amherst Street. Proceeds will be used for music, instruments, scholarships and musical programs for the benefit of Hollis students.
