**THE FEATURED ARTIST:**

**Juanita Tsu**

Juanita Tsu started playing the piano at age seven. She entered the National Academy of Arts in her native Taiwan at the age of fifteen, and almost immediately exhibited the tenacity and strength that continue to characterize her playing. Taiwanese newspapers lauded her complete control over the keyboard while she was still in her early teens. She came to the United States to study and received her Bachelor of Music degree from the Peabody Conservatory in 1968 and her Master of Music from the New England Conservatory in 1971. As a soloist, she has continued to impress critics in the United States, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Canada with a mature style developed under Jacob Maxin, Theodore Lettvin, Victor Rosenbaum, Leon Fleischer, and Elizabeth Katsenellenbogen. She has taught at the New England Conservatory of Music, and conducted the Chinese Intercollegiate Choral Society of Boston, as well as other groups and has made numerous television and radio appearances. Currently, she teaches at the University of Lowell.

**THE BAND:**

The Hollis Town Band is made up of over sixty members from a wide geographical area. It was founded in 1947 as the Hollis Church School Band, and has since evolved into the full fledged community band appearing tonight. It means a lot of different things to the different members -- for some it is a night out, for others it is a chance to get back in shape on instruments untouched for years. And for still others it is a chance to play music that challenges them to play beyond their abilities. But all members have a common bond -- the love of band music. The band rehearses once a week through every month except August, on Wednesday evenings at 7:30 in the Hollis Town Hall. New members are always welcome to come join the band. The philosophy of the band is to try to have the best time possible while making the best music possible. The youngest member is in the second grade, and the oldest member isn't about to say how old he is, but he has retired from one job already. Members come from as far away as Manchester, Londonderry, Jaffrey, and Peterborough. And of course there is the solid core of Hollis residents who have always been the backbone of the band. The band puts on a Strawberry Festival the last Sunday of every June, and an Apple Festival the first Sunday of every October. They start at 2:00 in the afternoon, rain or shine, so come join the band in a Hollis tradition.

**THE SOLOISTS:**

**David Deifik**

Dave Deifik began playing the flute at age 12, in New York City. He studied five years with Florence Nelson, flutist with the New York City Opera Orchestra. While in high school, Dave was a member of the New York City All City Orchestra. Curiously enough, at his first concert with this orchestra, the featured work was the Grieg Piano Concerto. While a pre-med student at Oberlin College, Dave had a chance to work with the fine faculty of the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. He currently is an obstetrician at Matthew Thornton and is quite active musically in the southern New Hampshire area. He has appeared as soloist with several area orchestras in addition to the Hollis Town Band, of which he has been a member for five years. Dr. Deifik is also the president of the Nashua Flute Choir as well as a featured performer in the Nashua Flute Choir Spring Concert tomorrow night, May 13th, at 7:30 at The First Church in Nashua.

**Rochelle Goren**

Rochelle Goren began playing the clarinet at age eight, in Philadelphia. She played all through high school, but she took a break for eight years while she went to college and started a career and a family. She is a computer analyst and enjoys playing the clarinet as a hobby. She began playing with the Hollis Town Band ten years ago, which is when she resumed her clarinet playing. She is an example to all who used to play a musical instrument but stopped for one reason or another -- it is never too late to start playing again. She is frequently heard with the Hollis Town Band Dixielanders.

**THE CONDUCTOR:**

David H. Bailey began to study music twenty-six years ago in Hanover, New Hampshire, when he took up the trumpet. He played trumpet all through high school, and majored in music at Colby College. While at Colby College he took up the study of conducting, working with Peter Re, Robert Hudson, and Gordon Bowle. He founded and directed the Colby Brass Players and was director of the Colby Marching Band for two years while he was president and student director of the Colby Band. After college, David studied musical instrument repair at Western Iowa Tech, and moved to the southern New Hampshire area in 1976. Since that time he has been repairing instruments, teaching music lessons on all woodwind and brass instruments, and performing throughout the area. In the past he has spent a year conducting the Nashua All City Youth Band, and was the musical arranger for the Communicate show at Nashua High School. This is David's fourth season as musical director of the Hollis Town Band, as well as his second season as conductor of the Nashua Flute Choir. David and his wife, violinist Alison Bailey, live in Nashua with their new son, Seth. David runs his own teaching studio and repair shop in Amherst.
