

Hollis Town Band Sets Pops Concert March 15

HOLLIS - The Hollis Town Band will premier a new composition, the "Hollis Town Band March" at its "pops" concert, Saturday, March 15, 8 p.m. at the Hollis Area High School, Hollis.

This new march, composed by Gordon Bowie, was recently selected by the band's executive board as the winner of the band's march competition. Last summer the band announced the competition, which solicited all interested composers to write an original march for the Hollis Town Band. Bowie's march was selected as the best

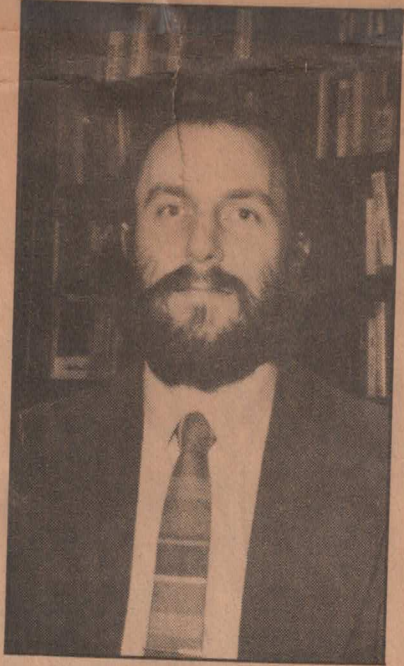
of the several entries submitted. Under the terms of the competition, Bowie will receive a monetary award and the Hollis Town Band will own all performance rights to its new march.

Gordon Bowie, who will conduct the march at the concert, is a private music teacher who resides in Winterport, Maine. He is a member of the Bangor, Maine Symphony Orchestra and the conductor of the Bangor Town Band. During the past year, five of his compositions for band have been premiered.

The concert is sponsored jointly by the Hollis Historical Society and the Hollis Town Band as a fund raiser for both organizations. It will be performed before an audience seated at tables in the high school gym. Homemade deserts, coffee, tea, and soft drinks will be available.

David Bailey, who joined the band this year as conductor, will lead the band in a program featuring a variety of classical and contemporary music. Included in the program are "Rhapsody for Band," "Try to Remember" from the musical show "The Fantasticks," Henry Mancini's "Tango Americano," "Academic Festival" by Johannes Brahms, Moussorgsky's "Pictures at an Exhibition" and "A Tribute to Count Basie." The concert will also include an "Old Time Sing-a-long," in which the audience will be encouraged to participate.

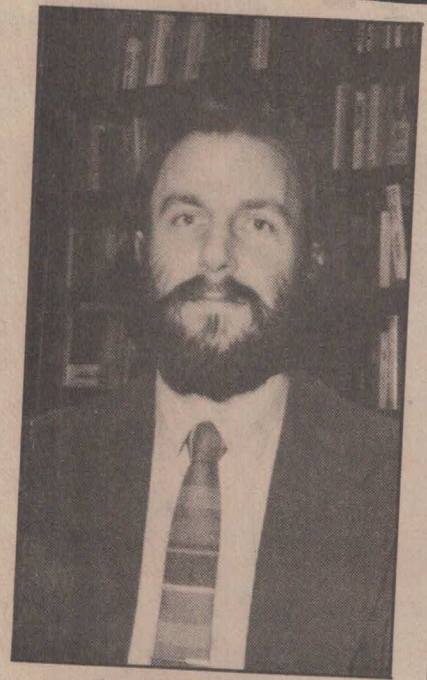
The first Temple Invitational Band Festival will be held on the Common in Temple on Sun., Aug. 3 starting at 2 pm.
